Zoom is a cloud-based video conferencing tool that supports video, audio, and chat. It's widely used for virtual classrooms, meetings, and webinars.

Signing Up and Downloading Zoom

- Visit <u>zoom.us</u> and click on "Sign Up for Free."
- Enter your email address, verify your account, and complete the registration process.
- Once registered, download the Zoom app for your device (Windows,

Mac, iOS, Android).



Joining a Zoom Meeting

- You can join a Zoom meeting by clicking on the meeting link provided by the host.
- Alternatively, open the Zoom app, click "Join," and enter the Meeting ID and passcode.

Basic Zoom Features

Once you're in a meeting, familiarize yourself with the following controls:

- Mute/Unmute: Control your microphone.
- Start/Stop Video: Turn your camera on or off.
- Participants: See who's in the meeting.
- Chat: Send messages to participants.
- *Mute/Unmute* Reactions: Provide non-verbal feedback like clapping or thumbs up.
 - Sharing Screen: By clicking on the share button.

Changing Backgrounds

- Click the arrow next to "Start Video" and select "Choose Virtual Background."
- 2. From the settings, choose a pre-installed background or upload your own.





Screen Sharing

- Click the "*Share*" button at the bottom of the Zoom window.
- Choose which screen or window you want to share and click "Share."



Breakout Rooms

- The host can assign participants to smaller groups through Breakout Rooms.
- As a participant, you will receive a prompt to join a room.



Using the Chat Feature

- Click on "Chat" in the toolbar to open the chat window.
- You can send a message to everyone or select a participant to send a private message.
- To share a file, click "File" and upload your document.



Reactions and Raising Hand

- Click on "Reactions" in the toolbar to choose from various emojis like clap or thumbs up.
- If you want to ask a question, use the "Raise Hand" feature to signal the host.

Progressive Certifications
